

AZA Grants Certification To Myakka City Lemur Reserve

Silver Spring, Maryland (March 30, 2011) – The Association of Zoos & Aquariums (AZA) today announced that Myakka City Lemur Reserve, operated by the Lemur Conservation Foundation, was granted certification by AZA's independent Accreditation Commission.

"Myakka City Lemur Reserve is one of the best in the world because it has met the highest standards in the world," said AZA President and CEO Jim Maddy. "It takes hard work and dedication to meet Association of Zoos and Aquariums Accreditation Standards."

To be certified, Myakka City Lemur Reserve underwent a thorough investigation to ensure it has and will continue to meet ever-rising standards, which include animal care, veterinary programs, conservation, education, and safety. AZA requires zoos and aquariums to successfully complete this rigorous accreditation process every five years in order to be members of the Association. The Reserve was first granted certification in 1996.

"As a member of the Association of Zoos and Aquariums, Myakka City Lemur Reserve is a true leader in wildlife conservation," Maddy added.

The certification process includes a detailed application and a meticulous on-site inspection by a team of trained zoo and aquarium professionals. The inspecting team observes all aspects of the institution's operation in areas such as animal care; keeper training; safety for visitors, staff, and animals; conservation efforts; veterinary programs; financial stability; risk management; and other areas. The inspection team prepares an extensive written report for the Accreditation Commission. Finally, top officials are interviewed at a formal Commission hearing, after which certification is granted, tabled, or denied. Any institution that is denied may reapply one year after the Commission's decision is made.
