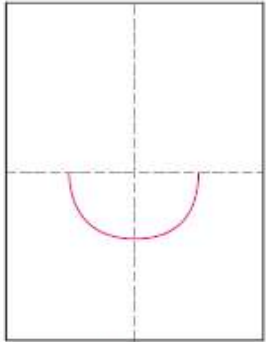
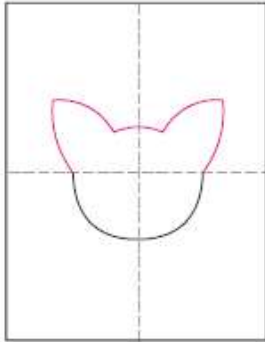


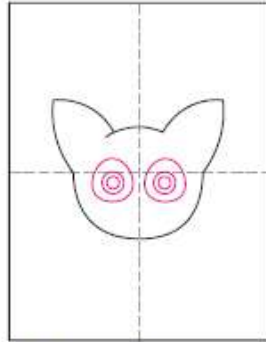
# DRAW YOUR OWN LEMUR



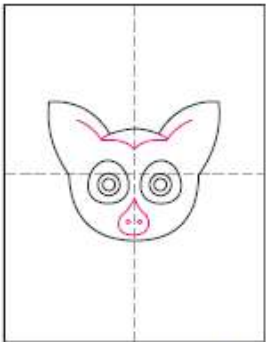
1. Draw a large U shape.



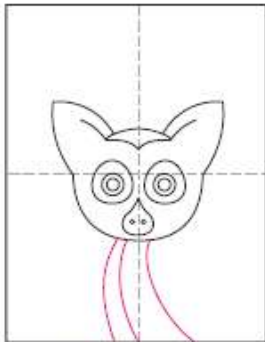
2. Add the ears and connect.



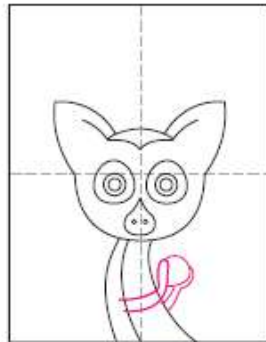
3. Draw eyes with rings.

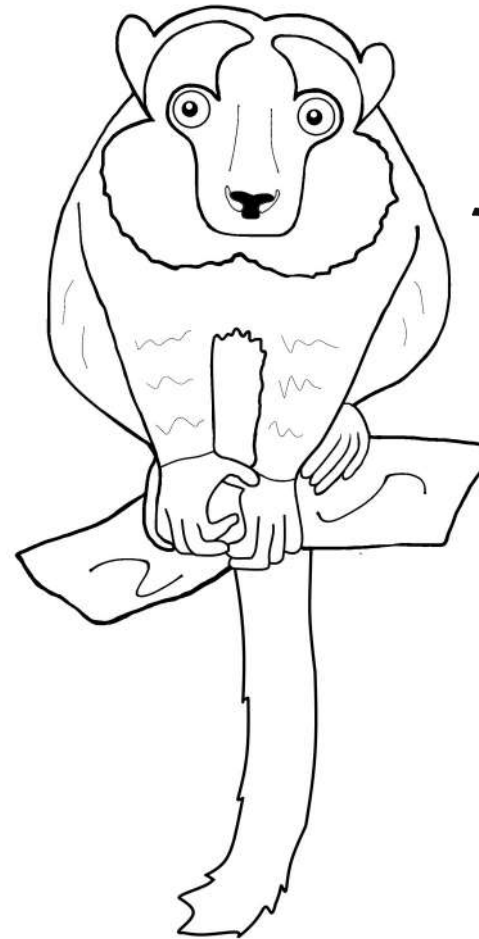

Lemurs have a small, second tongue under their big tongue to help keep their teeth clean and free of fur.

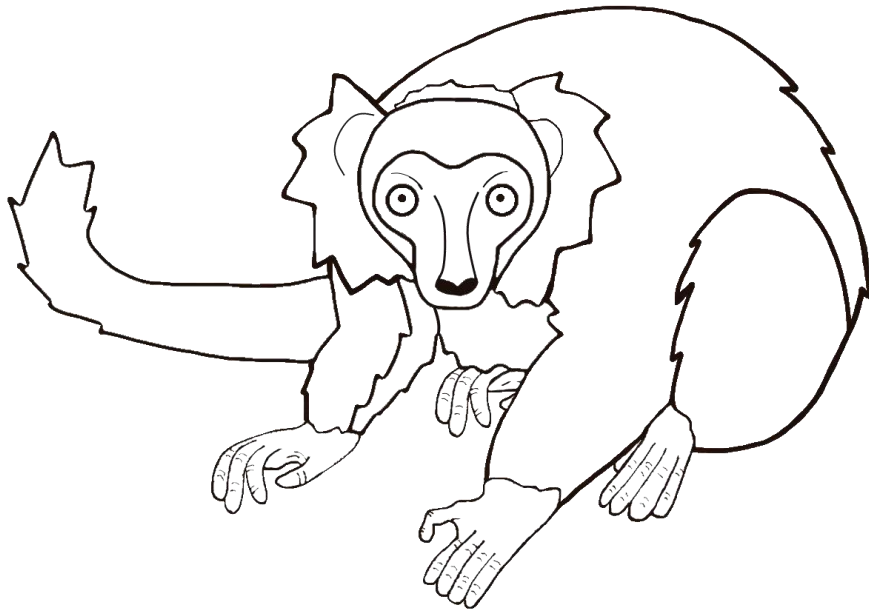

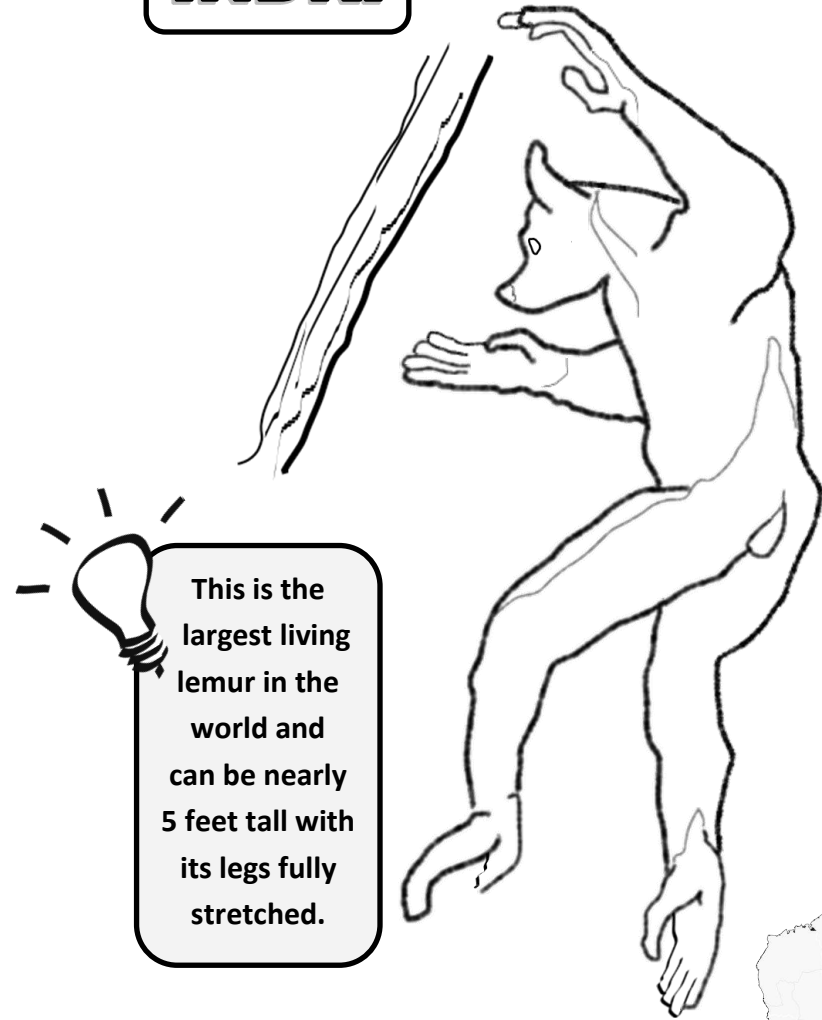
This lemur builds a nest for its babies.

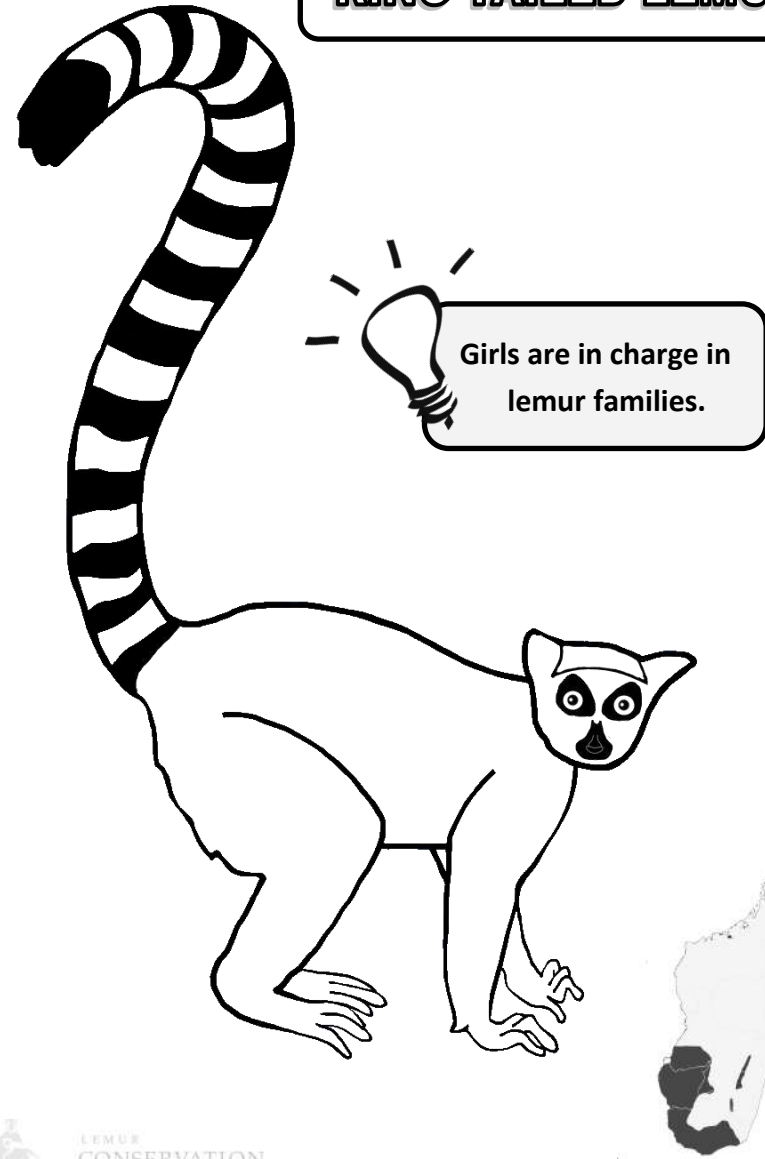

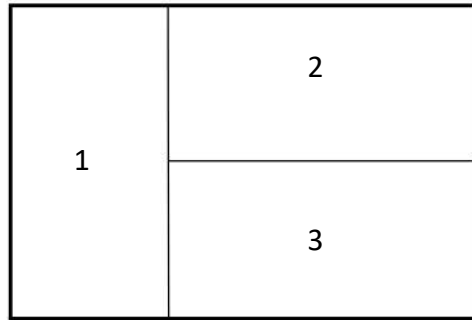
